

It was because of the LORD's anger that all this happened to Jerusalem and Judah, and in the end he thrust them from his presence. (2 Kings 24:20a)





In the meantime, Zedekiah rebelled against Babylon. So, the king of Babylon, Nebuchadnezzar, and his army surrounded Jerusalem. After two years, there was no food to eat. The Babylonian army broke through the city wall. That night, Zedekiah and his army escaped through a gate near the king's garden. But the enemy had them surrounded. Zedekiah was captured and sent away.

For the Parents

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In today's lesson, your child heard about Zedekiah, who did evil and did not obey God. God was angry. God would allow Zedekiah and the people of Judah to be captured and sent into exile. Review the lesson with your child, comparing God to a loving parent disciplining a rebellious child. Assure your child that disobedience has consequences (like timeout), but God always watches over him or her.
