

Obey and Rejoice

Lesson Scripture: Nehemiah 8:2-3, 5-6, 9-12

God's Word

- 2 So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of men and women and all who were able to understand. 3 He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.
- 5 Ezra opened the book. All the people could see him because he was standing above them; and as he opened it, the people all stood up. 6 Ezra praised the LORD, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, "Amen! Amen!" Then they bowed down and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground.
- 9 Then Nehemiah the governor, Ezra the priest and teacher of the Law, and the Levites who were instructing the people said to them all, "This day is holy to the Lord your God. Do not mourn or weep." For all the people had been weeping as they listened to the words of the Law. 10 Nehemiah said, "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is holy to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength." 11 The Levites calmed all the people, saying, "Be still, for this is a holy day. Do not grieve." 12 Then all the people went away to eat and drink, to send portions of food and to celebrate with great joy, because they now understood the words that had been made known to them.

Bible Story

Obey and Rejoice

Nehemiah 8:2-3, 5-6, 9-12

After the people of Israel had settled in their towns, there was an assembly of the people in the area before what was called the Water Gate

The people then told Ezra—who was the priest and a scribe (one who wrote down the laws of God)—to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses. The Book of the Law of Moses was the first five books of the Bible.

Ezra then read aloud from the Book of the Law to all the people gathered before him. The people listened attentively to the reading. When Ezra opened the Book of the Law, all the people stood up in reverence to the Word of God. Ezra then led the people in a period of praise and worship. The people lifted their hands in response to Ezra's praise to God and they shouted, "Amen! Amen!"

After the reading from the Book of the Law, Nehemiah the governor, Ezra, and the other worship leaders told the people that the day was sacred to the Lord and that they were not to mourn or weep. Instead, they were to enjoy their food and sweet drinks and send food and drinks to those who had none. As they celebrated, they were to remember that the joy of the Lord is their strength.

After listening to the instructions from Nehemiah and the other leaders, the people went to their homes to eat, drink, share with others, and—most of all—to celebrate because they now understood God's Word.
