

Lesson Scriptures: Leviticus 13:45-46: Luke 17:11-1



I Am Grateful

In biblical times, if you were a leper, then you must tear your clothes, leave your hair uncombed, cover the lower part of your face, and yell, "Unclean, unclean!" As long as you had the disease, you were thought of as unclean and must live outside the city, away from others.

One day, on His way to Jerusalem,
Jesus went along the border between
Samaria and Galilee. When He entered a

village, He was met by ten men who were lepers—they had a bad skin disease. They stood at a distance and shouted, "Jesus! Master! Have mercy on us!" Jesus saw them and said to them, "Go and let the priests examine you."

While on their way, they were healed. When one of them saw this, he came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself to the ground at Jesus' feet and thanked Him. The man was a Samaritan. Jesus said, "There were ten of you who were healed. Where are the other nine? Why is this foreigner the only one who came back to give thanks to God?" And Jesus said to him, "Get up and go. Your faith has made you well."

Key Verse

One of [the former lepers], when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. (Luke 17:15)






A Picture of Gratitude


Draw a picture in each box to complete part of today's Bible story lesson. The words to be drawn are in bold.
