


Do Right!

Lesson Scripture: Jonah 3:1-10

God's Word

1 Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: 2 "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you." 3 Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very large city; it took three days to go through it. 4 Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." 5 The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth. 6 When Jonah's warning reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with sackcloth and sat down in the dust. 7 This is the proclamation he issued in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. 8 But let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence. 9 Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish." 10 When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he relented and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened.

Bible Story

Do Right!

Jonah 3:1-10

The prophet Jonah can be called God's reluctant prophet. The beginning of the Bible story says that the word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time. This means that God had sent a word to Jonah before. The first time God's word came to Jonah, he refused to do what God wanted him to do. Instead, he went in the opposite direction of where God wanted him to go.

This time, however, Jonah obeyed the word of the Lord and went to the city called Nineveh. Nineveh was a very important city and was probably a large city—because it took three days for Jonah to travel throughout the city.

Jonah's message was that in forty days the city of Nineveh would be overturned. The people of Nineveh believed the message that Jonah preached. They declared a fast (no eating or drinking) and they put on sackcloth, which was a sign of their sorrow for sin and their action of repentance.

When word got to the king, he too put on sackcloth and sat down in the dust as a sign of repentance. The king also sent out an order commanding that everyone (even the animals) put on sackcloth and fast.

When God saw what the people of Nineveh did and how they turned from evil, He decided not to bring destruction upon the city. The people decided to do right.

preach the word of God.

Nicholas: The message Jonah preached was that God was going to destroy Nineveh for the evil

things the people had done.

Cornelius: When the people of Nineveh heard


the message Jonah preached, all the people decided to go on a fast and put on sackcloth to show their sorrow for their sins. Even the king joined in
